

Some errors and inaccuracies in *Weybridge Past* by Neil White, 1999

P25, right col, line 5	The Duke of York died on 5 January 1827, not in 1828 - Ref 1
P29, right col, last para	In 1830 the 7th Baron King was living in Ockham, not Woburn - Ref 2
P30, left col, last para	The King family title passed to the elder son, William, not Peter - Ref 2
P32, right col, last para	Vigo House was conveyed to Peter Locke King on 10 December 1879 and there is no reason to doubt that it remained in the ownership of the Locke Kings until Hugh gave the site for the building of the 1928 hospital. Rev W B Money was a tenant for many years - Refs 3 & 4
P33, left col, first para	The long-held tradition that Admiral Clinton built Clinton House was disproved by research in 1993 - Ref 5
P39, Plate 34	Triggs Lock on the Wey Navigation is some eight and a half miles upstream from Thames Lock on the Wey at Weybridge, with which it seems to have been confused - Ref 6
P49, Plate 48	Caption states correctly that 'Templemere' was built in Oatlands Park but then adds that it stood at Temple Market, which is more than 1km distant. A modern development perpetuates the name of the now demolished 'Templemere' mansion - Ref 7
P62, left col, line 13	The track was constructed in less than twelve months, not eighteen - Ref 8
P65	The Queen's Head is in Bridge Road, not Bridge Street
P70, Plate 67	The painting is not of 66 Baker Street, but probably painted by Eveline Luxford who lived at number 66 Baker Street
P88, left col, first para	Benjamin Scott came to live at Heath House in 1854, as is correctly stated on p48. Also, pl 87 shows Rev Baron's ministry as 1865-1880: it should be 1890, as given correctly on page 84 - Ref 9
P92, left col, first para	The Vigo House clinic was transferred to the old hospital in 1928 (i.e. the building shown in pl 95) and named Locke King Clinic after Hugh (who died in 1926) not Ethel - Ref 10
P97, right col, para 3	St James's Day is July 25 not June 25 – Ref 11
P121, right col	The meeting of 18th August 1914 was chaired by Sir Charles Walpole and Ethel's name was not among those present – Ref 12
P123, left col, para 2	Toc H moved to Waverley Road Congregational Mission Hall in 1928, not the Congregational Church lecture hall in Queen's Road – Ref 13
